Many women worldwide still go about their daily routines as their mothers and grandmothers have done for generations: others have gone outdoors to work side by side with men. Are these women satisfied with their new situation? What do they complain about? Here is a career woman, Tamara *Ivanova*. 43. Russia, giving her opinion about her new way of living.

Ivanova, who was interviewed on the condition that her real name would not be used, is a biologist. She shares a two-bedroom apartment in Moscow with her husband, mother-in-law and one of her two adult children. She enjoys her job as an analyst of forensic pathology and earns a yearly salary of about 4.800\$, the same as similarly qualified men in her profession.

As a young mother, she received paid maternity leave and day care. Her family now has free health benefits. Ivanova, in short, has the sort of rights and professional opportunities that are a dream for most of the world's women. Nonetheless, she is angry about the conditions Russian women must endure: "After a woman marries in our country, she no longer lives. She only exists," says Ivanova. "She is always short of sleep. A married Russian woman has three professions: her career, motherhood and house-keeping. They take all her time and energy, and she is left a worn-out wreck". She is critical of Russian men for scorning domestic chores, though she admits that it is a fault more of tradition than of discrimination. "Women run this country," Ivanova says, "but the bosses are men". She reads underground feminist literature but considers herself neither a dissident nor a feminist. "For women's conditions to improve there has to be a change in the whole society. Men must share the burdens of the family".
