I've never even seen most of these people, but they feel like true friends to me: friends that live all over the world, friends I wouldn't know if it wasn't for the internet. True, I would love to meet them in the real life. But even if I don't, these people remain very real and dear to me, because I really know them. I certainly know them better than the guy who lives next door to me with whom I have nothing in common.

[4] So, my answer to the question 'Are internet relationships real?' is YES, YES, YES. And don't let your families and 'real' friends convince you differently. Just because you can't see someone, doesn't mean you can't care about them. The internet allows you the opportunity to know someone for who they are and not for how they look or how they dress. In some ways, the people you know on the internet are more real than the ones you pass on the street.
